Understanding the role of the mentor in Early Career Framework Training

The role of the mentor is foundational to the ECF training programme: it is what will drive the greatest improvements in the knowledge, skills, and confidence of our ECTs throughout their induction.

The mentor will provide support and challenge and be the ECT's chief guide through their first two years in the profession.

Since mentors lie at the heart of the ECF initiative, it is crucial they benefit equally, and that this becomes part of their own professional development.


We will support mentors to develop a constructive developmental relationship with the ECT they are supporting, using the principles of Instructional Coaching and harnessing their own experience and expertise.

Mentors will receive a full package of training from us, which includes face-to-face events, online resources, and webinars to ensure they are fully supported to undertake the role.

The support provided will be as flexible as we can make it, to fit around in-school commitments and busy workload.

Mentors will also be allocated a 'buddy', who will be another mentor from your own school, from another school or linked by subject/specialism.

Mentors will be encouraged to have regular contact with their 'buddy' to discuss progress, challenges and ideas, and there is time set aside in training schedules for these peer-to-peer sessions.

Funding:

When accessing the full induction programme through Redhill Teaching Hub, funding will cover:

- **£1200** to fund 5% off timetable in Year 2 of induction for all ECTs to undertake induction activities including training and mentoring
- £900 to fund 20 hours of mentoring across Year 2 of ECT training
- additional funding of £1576.10 for mentor backfill for time off timetable for training

Total funding: £3676.10 per ECT in our region accessing the full induction programme
