RQT SUPPORT NETWORK

The RQT support network is aimed at second and third year primary, special and secondary teachers. Following disrupted training and NQT years, this network aims to develop a teacher's understanding of classroom practice, underpinned by Early Career Framework content and the teacher standards. The aim is to develop confident, reflective and skilled classroom practitioners, delivering expert input, the opportunity to share best practice and coaching to participants.

This network is an opportunity for recently qualified teachers to develop relationships with colleagues across schools. The network will spotlight the key classroom challenges, develop key strategies and provide valuable support to effectively assess, give feedback and create a positive climate for learning across a range of sessions . Participants will be able to develop and share their professional understanding and practice and, subsequently, have a positive impact upon students' learning in the classroom. Due to the pandemic, recently qualified teachers have missed out on the chance to work alongside a range of colleagues and share best practice in a face to face setting. Therefore, our network will provide these opportunities to moderate, discuss and build an ethos of sharing and communicating different approaches to classroom practice.

- Why is engagement such a priority?
- How do we protect our wellbeing and work/life balance?
- How does assessment, marking and feedback impact progress?
